

## UK DCTN SAS and CESR Fellowships

Since 2010, eleven SAS doctors/clinicians undertaking the CESR pathway have benefitted from this award (see full listing in the table below), including:

### **Dr Andy Hodder 2019 UK DCTN SAS Fellow**

Dr Hodder fully embraced all the UK DCTN activities and was a valued and respected member of the UK DCTN Steering Committee for the duration of his award. For his research activity, he a Cochrane Systematic Review Team for the review 'Psychological and educational interventions for managing eczema'. The protocol for this was published in Nov 21 *Psychological and educational interventions for managing eczema (protocol)* Heidi Singleton, Andrew Hodder, Dwayne Bowers, Elizabeth Doney et al Published Nov 21 <https://www.cochranelibrary.com/cdsr/doi/10.1002/14651858.CD014932/full> and Dr Hodder has remained part of the review team. Now his Fellowship has come to an end, he has maintained links with the UK DCTN by joining the Trial Generation and Prioritisation Panel.

### **Dr Susan Hatfield 2014 UK DCTN SAS Fellow**

Dr Hatfield took part in a number of research projects including an analysis of the use of CONSORT guidelines in papers reported in Cochrane Skin reviews and an Annual Evidence Based Update on eczema. She has gone on to be involved in recruiting into both the Hi-light study on vitiligo and the ALPHA hand eczema study.

### **Dr Areti Makrygeorgou 2012 UK DCTN SAS Fellow**

Based in Glasgow, Dr Makrygeorgou joined the Cochrane Systematic Review update team on Probiotics for Atopic Eczema as part of her UK DCTN SAS Fellow activities. She also become involved in the HOME core outcome measures for eczema initiative and wrote up a meeting report for the British Journal of Dermatology about the ISAD international eczema conference, hosted in the UK in 2012. After developing her clinical research skills via this award, Dr Makrygeorgou became a local investigator for the Hi-Light study recruiting a significant number of patients into this trial investigating the use of handheld light units for the treatment of vitiligo.

### **Dr Alison Godwin 2010 UK DCTN SAS Fellow**

Dr Godwin undertook a number of activities with us including attending the annual evidence-based update meeting on acne, becoming an independent reviewer for the GREAT eczema database and contributing to a Cochrane Systematic Review on interventions for bullous pemphigoid. In 2016 she undertook a successful CESR application using her UK DCTN SAS Fellow research experiences as part of this and is now working as a Consultant Dermatologist in North Wales.
